
Zero Waste Victoria



Disposal would increase by up to 40% by 2040 without meaningful intervention




FIGURE 2. Landfill disposal targets

Government Roles and Responsibilities

FEDERAL

Hazardous waste transport, infrastructure funding, research and guidance

PROVINCIAL

Regulates landfills and pollution, enforces "producer pays"

REGIONAL

Solid waste management planning, landfills and material bans

CITY OF VICTORIA

Residential organics and garbage collection, public realm bins, yard waste, litter, illegally dumped items


